


509–49 BCE


50,000 BCE

Roman Empire begins when Octavius changes his name to Augustus. In his honor, they name the month of September. Fun fact: when someone dies, any name is a dead name.






1300s–1600s — Italian Renaissance

Monday, July 24



Welcome to the Uffizi! This is Florence's premier art museum. You probably want to start by looking at these newsletters, written by a rather cranky old man in the pre-World War period. He put a lot of effort into these. And, although they weren't popular in his life, aren't good, and still aren't important, they were cheap.

At the Uffizi, we pride ourselves in our multi-story collection of some of the finest ancient and renaissance art— the two periods in which art existed. We also have a very long entryway which allows us to display the entire collection of *Leonardo*, a zine that might never have been read. For example, certainly no copyeditor has read it.

The Uffizi is around the corner from the *Piazza di Santa Maria del Fiore*. 
Please help. And please don't send us your own newsletters. It's a played-out format.



Hot Carlos Sabbatical



January



I've girlbossed for twenty years to get to the top of my career. Now I'm 40, I'm considering leaving and becoming a nude fortune teller.


